How to contribute to the Snap-a-striper project:

New in 2020 - Images with harvested heads, only. Because this research relies on comparing fish shape and chemical data from the otolith, we are only able to use images of striped bass that are accompanied by that fish's head (raw or cooked).

- 1. Fill out the card below.
- 2. For Location, please fill in the name of the zone you were fishing:
  - 1. South Coast: Kittery to Biddeford Pool
  - 2. Saco Bay: Biddeford Pool to Two Lights
  - 3. Casco Bay: Two Lights to Cape Small
  - 4. Kennebec: Cape Small to Cape Newagen
- 5. Mid Coast: Cape Newagen to Owls Head
- 6. Penobscot: Owls Head to Swan's Island
- 7. Acadia: Swan's Island to Schoodic Peninsula
- 8. Downeast: east of Schoodic Peninsula
- 3. Please also check the appropriate box for the habitat in which you were fishing
- 4. Lay your fish on a flat surface with this filled-out data card (bottom half of this sheet) next to it.
- 5. Take photo from directly overhead looking straight down at the side of fish; make sure the entire fish and data card and ruler (bottom half of this page) are in view. Check your photo!
- 6. Do either of the following:
